





Still appearing 'by public demand'

eorge V was King, Stanley Baldwin was serving his second term of office and women were enfranchised on the same basis as men. The West Indies played their first Test match in England (they lost all three in the series by an innings) and Blackburn Rovers won the FA Cup. The inaugural Oscars

were held and Lady Chatterley's Lover was first exposed to the world.

The year . . . ? 1928. In those distant days before television and videos when you had to make your own entertainment a band of local enthusiasts decided to join together to form a drama group to keep themselves and others in the commu-

nity amused and enthralled. And so was born the Wimborne Dramatic Society (later to change its name to Wimborne Drama Club).

Their very first production, Ambrose Applejohn's Adventure, proved so popular that a repeat performance had to be given 'by public demand'. With

Leonard "Motty" Mottram the driving force behind the Club, early shows were staged in the Women's Institute Hall and when that was demolished, activities were transferred to Church House and later to the new Secondary Modern School at Pamphill (now QE); and from 1970 the Club has enjoyed a


happy association with the Allendale Centre.

works of Thomas Hardy, George Bernard Shaw, Oscar Wilde, Noel Coward, Arthur Miller and Alan Ayckbourn, among many others, have been tackled with gusto, style and no little success by directors, actors and back-stage hands alike.

Finding the financial resources to run a dramatic society and stage such ambitious productions can place a heavy burden on some groups but Wimborne Drama Club has been fortunate and privileged to have been well supported by benefactors, such as the late Air Marshall Sir John Bradley, patrons, sponsors, Club President Sir Michael Hanham and Lady Hanham, and of course

wonderfully receptive audiences.

It is this generosity and warmth of spirit that has enabled Wimborne Drama Club to go from strength to strength such that this week we are able to make our debut on stage at Wimborne's own theatre.

And as you settle into your seats for tonight's performance you can congratulate yourselves for demonstrating that despite the very many alternative forms of entertainment available in 1994 live theatre productions, especially when staged at such an atmospheric and vibrant venue as The Tivoli Theatre, are as popular today as they were back in 1928.

Director's Notes

A lan Ayckbourn wrote *Bedroom Farce* for Scarborough in 1975. The play subsequently transferred to the National Theatre in March 1977.

It is a joyous, robust comedy which explores the way a thoroughly self-obsessed, neurotic couple wreak havoc on their friends and relatives. Ayckbourn believes in making people laugh first and then think "Are we really like that?"

He feels that although people do care about those nearest and dearest to them they tend to handle each other in boxing rather than kid gloves!

Ayckbourn's own analysis of why he wrote *Bedroom Farce* is typically unpretentious (and unrevealing): in the middle of his serious period "this rather jolly play suddenly arrived from nowhere and rather surprised me". Audiences have continued to be startled by the wit, perception and accessibility of one of Britain's leading playwrights ever since.
