In choosing this Play for their third public production, after the more or less light-hearted frivolities of the CHILTERN HUNDREDS and the realistic dramatics of SALOON BAR, the Drama Club realises the risk of appearing to be too ambitious; but they also realise that they would not be doing justice to their right to exist if they failed at least to have a go at plays of all types. So, for a start, this is one.

The four years that have gone by since its original showing have not, we feel, altered to any extent the problems and difficulties it presents with that skill and sense of the theatre which are among Mr. Priestley's gifts as a playwright. There may, of course, be varied opinions about the various members of the Linden family; but, at least, they are interesting and, we assume, typical and alive, while the things they discuss are still the things we discuss—and shall go on discussing.

So, with that as a background, we feel justified in having a go!

Incidentally, the next production of the Club will be BONAVENTURE, a very moving play indeed, by Charlotte Hastings. This will be in the early spring of next year.
