System of Marking

The Adjudicator will deliver a public adjudication on each play appearing at the Festival, and will use as a guide the following system of marking:

Acting 40; Production 35; Stage Presentation 10;

Endeavour, Originality and Attainment 15.

Each company is allowed ten minutes to set the stage and five minutes to strike, which could, but rarely does result in an interval of fifteen minutes between each play.

1st. Class Certificate for obtaining over 75 marks.

2nd. Class Certificate for obtaining over 65 marks.

CLASS 1 - For players up to and including 18 years

CLASS 2 - Mixed groups.

CLASS 3 - a) All female, b) All male.

CLASS 4 - Novice.
