



Born in Ashford, Kent John served in the R.A.F. at the end of the war and became interested in acting and Concert Party work. He moved to Melton Mowbray in 1960 joining the "Melton Players", coming to Poole in 1962 when he joined Broadstone for whom he has played many leading and supporting roles. John is a Lecturer in Electrical Engineering at Bournemouth and Poole College of Further Education.

JANE SHERWILL made her first appearance with the Club as Sorel Bliss in "Hay Fever", also by Noel Coward, and followed this with the part of Helen Winter in "The Other Fellows Oats". She took part in several school plays under the guidance of Duggie Trehearne, and trained for ballet reaching Sadlers Wells Scholarship in 1959. Jane appeared as Monique in "Darling Mr. London" and had the leading role in "Shock" our 1980 Autumn production.

JAN STEVENSON made her debut with the Club in a practically non-speaking part in our Spring production of "George & Margaret", and as a result of her success landed the role of Ruth in this production. Married, with 2 boys, Jan leads a very busy life but finds being a member of the Drama Club a very interesting hobby.

THE CAST

DAVID GREEN joined the Club in 1975 and his first role was that of Robert Danvers, the male lead, in 1976 production of "There's a Girl in my Soup".
